They have worked hard, coordinating their time and efforts to contribute to our students' educational journey. 2. SCHOOL ROUTINES

2.1 Attendance

At Yu Neng Primary, we emphasise regular and punctual attendance. We believe that students are more likely to make optimum progress in their development of healthy habits, lifeskills, character and academic learning with regular attendance in school.

Parents are reminded <u>NOT</u> to take their child out of school during term time without valid reasons, including travelling abroad. <u>If there is a need, it is necessary to request for leave of absence in advance from the Principal through the Form Teachers</u>. Absence from school must be covered by a medical certificate (MC) or a letter of excuse from parents/guardians, which should be handed to the Form Teacher upon your child's return to school. We appreciate your kind understanding and cooperation in this matter.

2.2 Health and Well-being Matters

Your child's health and well-being are of utmost importance to us. We want to ensure that the school is a safe and healthy environment for all our students and staff. We seek parents' support to keep schools a safe environment for students. If your child is unwell, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. If your child is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility (e.g., by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions with big groups). MOE will continue to monitor the situation and adjust the response measures when necessary.

Temperature-taking will be conducted at the beginning of each semester. Please check that your child's thermometer is in good working condition, and it is with him/her at all times. If your child has misplaced his/her thermometer, a replacement can be purchased from the school bookshop at \$5.30 per piece. Every P1 student has been issued with a new Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT) on Tue 02 Jan 2024. This is a one-off distribution and any future replacement of ODTs will have to be borne by parents.

The school will continue to practise cohort recess timing and staggered dismissal to better safeguard the wellbeing of our students. During staggered dismissals, parents may wait at the sheltered

walkways at the dismissal gates. In the event of inclement weather, Gate 5 will not be open. P2 and P3 students will be dismissed via Gate 4. Please refer to the tables below for the details.

2.3.1 Academic Support

We will be conducting *FUNdamentals*, an after-school programme aimed to strengthen foundational knowledge and skills for **selected P4 to P6 students**. These are customised and differentiated lessons that are designed to further support your child/ward as needed. *FUNdamentals* lessons will be conducted <u>face-to-face in school</u> starting in **Term 1 Week 5 i.e. Mon 29 Jan 2024 onwards**. The lessons will be conducted from 2.00p.m. - 3.30p.m.

2.3.2 Co-Curricular Activities (CCA)

CCA is integral to the holistic development of students. Through their active participation in CCA, students are provided with varied and authentic opportunities to develop their character and 21st Century Competencies. In addition, CCA provides students with a platform to discover their interests and talents, which will help students to lead a balanced life. All P3 to P6 students are strongly encouraged to participate in a CCA. **P3 students will select their CCAs from 03 Jan to 10 Jan 2024.** This year, P3 students had an introduction of the various CCAs and a briefing on Wed 03 Jan by Mr Low & Mr Eugene Tan. P3 students will have an option of choosing up to three CCAs in order of their preference. The results of their CCA allocation will be shared with them by **Mon 22 Jan 2024**. P3 students can look forward to beginning their CCA together with their seniors.

All CCAs will be conducted <u>face-to-face in school</u> starting from Term 1 Week 5 i.e. Mon 29 Jan 2024, for <u>P3 to P6</u> students. Respective CCA teachers-in-charge will inform their CCA students of the details and arrangement.

3. UPCOMING EVENTS

3.1 Primary 5 Project Work

Project Work (PW) is a multidisciplinary learning experience that allows students to think creatively and critically to apply the knowledge learnt in lessons in the real-world context. Students will also reflect on and evaluate their work processes, learning attitudes and continuously work on them to improve. In Yu Neng, our PW takes on a blended approach where students employ the effective use of technology to hone their research skills, communicate ideas and collaborate with peers online. They would also harness the affordances of technology to engage an authentic audience in the presentation of their work confidently and motivate their audience to action in their causes.

There will be scheduled Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days for P3 to P5 during PW to provide the opportunity and experience for students to demonstrate the necessary digital literacy skills and dispositions as they work towards becoming self-directed and independent learners. On HBL Days, students of the mentioned levels are expected to stay at home to engage in planned online and offline learning activities. Your child will also be provided with instructions on how to access their learning materials by his/her teachers. Please make home care arrangements for your child if he/she has home-based learning on the above-mentioned dates. Students enrolled in our school-based Student Care Centre (SCC) may come in from 1.30pm on the mentioned days. Do work with our Big Heart SCC directly.

This year, our P5 students will embark on a rice-planting journey to learn more about food sustainability. The P5 HBL Day will be on **Wed 14 Feb**. More information will be provided via the letter to parent nearer to the date.

3.2 SMART Card Photo-taking for P1s and P6s

Smart Card photo-taking for P1s and P6s will take place on Wed 17 Jan. Students are expected to come to school in their full school uniform with ties.

3.3 School Health Visit

The Ministry of Health (MOH), School Health Service (SHS) visits schools each year to conduct health screenings of students to ensure care and protection of their health. We are scheduled for the health visits by the SHS team from **Fri 26 Jan to Mon 05 Feb 2024**. We will collect the Health

Booklet from the P1 and P5 classes and pass them to the FTs by **12 Jan 2024**. Please refer to the MOH letter sent out via Parent's Gateway on Fri 05 Jan for details.

3.4 Meet-the-Parents Session 1 (MPS1)

Partnering parents/guardians is an important part of Yu Neng education experience and journey. We believe and are committed to building effective home-school partnerships to nurture and develop every student. Our first virtual Meet-the-Parents session (MPS) has been scheduled on **Sat 27 Jan 2024** for all levels. The session aims to **introduce parents to key personnel and respective level form teachers** and provide parents with **key information pertaining to the level**.

4. IMPORTANT THINGS TO NOTE

4.1 School Attire & School Uniform Supplier

As the national gesture towards mask-wearing remains consistent, students will continue to be allowed to wear either their school uniform or PE attire daily. This aims to provide greater support to all students. Do note that students are to tuck in their shirt/t-shirt at all times. Students will be expected to wear the school uniform with their ties for the termly Celebration Day, to be held on 08 March, 24 May, 23 Aug and 14 Nov. Similarly for the annual class photo-taking for all levels this year, students will be required to be in their school uniform with school tie.

We would also like to inform you that the school has appointed **Jeep Sing Fashion** as our new school uniform supplier with effect from 01 January 2024. 4.2 School Security Measures

We have put in place measures that emphasise safety and security as top-priority to maintain a conducive learning environment for all our students and staff. These measures apply to everyone entering the school or waiting in the school grounds.

- All visitors are required to report to the security desk at the school fover to register their visit.
- Please report to the general office and obtain a visitor's pass if you have an official appointment with a member of the school staff.
- Parents or caregivers will not be allowed to wait within the school compound when the school is in session. You are advised to wait at your child's designated dismissal gate punctually.
- Please note that your child will be dismissed via Gate 4 from CCA or other after school activities.

4.4 Safety Messages

4.5 Neighbouring Construction Works





Parents may have noticed that there are construction works nearby the school. Currently, drain diversion works are ongoing to prepare for subsequent BTO flats that will be adjacent to Yu Neng Primary School, as announced at an earlier press release. We have been working closely with the relevant builders to ensure minimal disruptions to our students and staff. We will continue to monitor the works and put in place measures for learning continuity.

4.6 Fire Drill

The school will be conducting a fire drill on Wed 24 Jan 2024 which aims to familiarise students, school staff and vendors with emergency procedures. It is an essential safety exercise that provides the experience for everyone in the school building to know the evacuation plan and to heighten awareness of personal safety in the event of a real emergency. Parents are strongly encouraged to spend time to talk with your child to reinforce the above-mentioned safety messages.

4.7 Insurance for Students

All students are covered with the Group Personal Accident (GPA) Insurance by NTUC Income. For more details of the insurance plan and coverage, please refer to the fact sheet attached to this letter.

4.8 Birthday Celebrations

To ensure the school remains a safe place for all students and staff, the school will not accept requests from parents to celebrate their children's birthdays in school. The guideline is put in place to prevent:

- Potential food safety and allergies incidents
- Loss of curriculum time and/ or recess time for play
- Unnecessary pressure upon students to get their parents to organise celebrations for them

We seek your understanding in cooperating with the school on this matter.
