#### 3. UPCOMING EVENTS

# 3.1 YNPS e-Open House



As part of our outreach efforts to parents and the wider community, we are pleased to announce the launch of our e-Open House. This virtual event provides an opportunity for parents and the public to learn more about our school through our website.

Themed "A Legacy of Growth, A Future of Promise," the e-Open House will feature key highlights such as Our YN Experience and the Yu Neng Primary School Tour videos. The event will be

# 3.2 Cultural Performance Exposure Scheme (CPES)

On Wednesday, 2 July, our Primary 4 Chinese Language students (excluding those enrolled in Higher Chinese) will participate in the Cultural Performance Exposure Scheme (CPES) programme (文化随意门"计划) at Tampines East Community Centre. This initiative is designed to enrich students' understanding and appreciation of Chinese language arts by exposing them to traditional cultural performances. During the programme, students will enjoy a professional Chinese opera production titled *The Monkey King Borrowed Treasure from the Dragon Palace* (龙宫借宝) and gain insights into the fundamentals of opera, including the instruments and movements involved.

#### 3.3 P6 Learning Journey to Lee Kong Chian Natural History Museum

As part of the Science Department's ongoing efforts to enhance students' understanding of real-world scientific concepts, our Primary 6 students will embark on a learning journey to the Lee Kong Chian Natural History Museum in Term 3, from Thursday, 3 July to Friday, 1 August. They will participate in the Singapore Biodiversity and Adaptation Workshop, which aims to deepen their knowledge of Singapore's rich biodiversity and the various adaptations exhibited by animals. Through this workshop, students will explore different structural adaptations and develop the ability to infer behavioural adaptations by examining a range of animal specimens. #### 3.4 Visit by K2 students from Preschools

On Friday, 4 July, our school will be hosting K2 students from three preschools. Our Primary 1 students will warmly welcome these young visitors into their classrooms, with some acting as buddies to guide their juniors through various activities. #### 3.5 FAME@YN

FAME@YN is a platform designed to give students the opportunity to showcase their talents and build confidence. All Primary 1 to 3 students are invited to express their interest in performing in August 2025, during their respective recess periods. #### 3.6 Math Week

Our annual Math Week will take place from Tuesday, 8 July to Friday, 11 July. Throughout the week, students will engage in a range of enriching activities during curriculum time and recess, all designed to deepen their appreciation and understanding of mathematics. These activities aim to broaden students' mathematical knowledge, encourage the application of concepts to real-world contexts, and highlight the relevance of mathematics in everyday life. We appreciate your continued support in fostering a love for learning and mathematical curiosity in our students.

#### 3.7 Student Leaders' Investiture 2025 & Prefects' Investiture 2025

At Yu Neng, we are dedicated to developing future leaders grounded in strong values. As part of our Total Learning Experience, we aim to provide opportunities for all students to excel and pursue their passions fully. Aligned with the theme "Leadership Ignite", the Student Leaders' Investiture 2025 seeks to inspire our student leaders to discover their passion, drive, and purpose to lead. We encourage them to embrace student agency by stepping forward confidently, taking ownership, and shouldering greater responsibilities. Through this, they will continue to be a positive influence, guiding others and contributing meaningfully to our school community.

The Investiture ceremony will be held on Friday, 11 July, in the School Hall in the morning. This event marks the official appointment of our student leaders, including the newly appointed Primary 3 Prefects and CCA Leaders, as they assume their roles with pride and purpose. # 3.9 P3 & P4 Home-Based Learning Day (HBL)

Project Work (PW) offers a multidisciplinary learning experience that encourages students to think creatively and critically, applying knowledge gained in lessons to real-world contexts. Through this process, students also reflect on and evaluate their work processes and learning attitudes, continually striving for improvement. At Yu Neng, our Project Work adopts a blended learning approach, where students effectively utilise technology to enhance their research skills, communicate ideas, and collaborate with peers online. They also leverage technological tools to confidently present their work to authentic audiences, inspiring action on their chosen causes.

The scheduled Home-Based Learning (HBL) Day for <u>Primary 4 Project Work is on Wednesday, 16 July</u>, and for <u>Primary 3 Project Work on Wednesday, 23 July</u>. These HBL days provide students with valuable opportunities to demonstrate essential digital literacy skills and cultivate the dispositions necessary to become self-directed and independent learners. On these HBL days, Primary 3 and Primary 4 students are expected to remain at home to engage in planned online and offline learning activities. Teachers will provide students with clear instructions on how to access the required learning materials. We kindly ask parents to make the necessary home care arrangements for their child.

Students enrolled in our school-based Student Care Centre (SCC) may attend from 1:30 pm on the respective days. Please coordinate directly with our Big Heart SCC for arrangements. Additional information is available in the letter sent to parents via Parents Gateway.

# 3.10 Commemoration of Racial Harmony

The theme for this year's Racial Harmony Day is *Singapore: Our People, Our Tapestry*. It highlights how our diverse cultural threads are woven together to form a cohesive and vibrant society. While these threads may occasionally fray due to tensions or external influences, it is our shared responsibility to strengthen and preserve them through mutual respect and understanding.

To commemorate this occasion, the school has planned a series of meaningful activities and experiences from Monday, 21 July to Friday, 25 July. As part of the celebration, we strongly encourage all students to come dressed in an ethnic attire of their choice on Friday, 25 July, paired with their school shoes, to honour and appreciate Singapore's rich cultural diversity. Students from Primary 3 to Primary 6 may bring along their school uniform or PE attire to change into after assembly.

#### 3.11 P4 Social Studies Learning Journey to Kreta Ayer

Our Primary 4 students will be visiting the Kreta Ayer Heritage Gallery on Tuesday, 22 July, Wednesday, 23 July, and Thursday, 7 August. The visit aims to deepen students' understanding of Chinese heritage and culture while promoting social interaction and fostering a sense of community. Further details will be shared via Parents Gateway in due course.

#### 3.12 P5 Rice Appreciation Day

The rice plants harvested by our Primary 5 students in Term 2, Week 10 are now ready for threshing and milling in preparation for Rice Appreciation Day, which will be held on Monday, 28 July. Students will soon begin the threshing and milling process during Term 3, Weeks 2 and 3, as they prepare to enjoy the fruits of their labour. In addition to celebrating the rice harvest, students will also present findings from the investigative experiments they conducted in Term 2. These findings are expected to offer valuable insights into how the rice germination process can be further enhanced in future cycles.

### 3.13 P1 Social Studies Learning Journey to Jacob Ballas Children's Garden

Our Primary 1 students will be embarking on a field-based learning journey to Jacob Ballas Children's Garden on Tuesday, 29 July, Wednesday, 30 July, and Friday, 1 August. The objective of this learning experience is to nurture students' curiosity and appreciation for the natural world. Please note that the learning journey may be postponed in the event of inclement weather, and a replacement session may be arranged, subject to availability. Further details will be provided in the consent form on Parents Gateway, which will be shared at a later date.

#### 3.14 Self-Directed Learning Days during PSLE Written Papers

To support the conduct of the PSLE Written Papers, a number of our teachers will be involved in invigilation duties. As such, Self-Directed Learning (SDL) Days have been scheduled for Primary 3 to Primary 5 students during this period. These SDL Days are designed to foster greater independence and self-management in learning. Students will be provided with meaningful learning tasks by their teachers to complete at home. # 4.1 Health and Well-being Matters

MOE will continue to closely monitor the public health situation and adjust precautionary measures as needed.

As part of our ongoing health protocols, a temperature-taking exercise will be conducted on Wednesday, 9 July, with a familiarisation exercise on Friday, 4 July. Kindly ensure that your child has a working personal thermometer and brings it to school daily.

#### 4.2 School Security and Safety Measures

To ensure a safe and secure environment for all staff and students, the school has implemented a range of safety and security measures as part of our ongoing commitment to student well-being. We seek your partnership in reinforcing these values at home by encouraging and role-modelling safe behaviours. For example, please remind your child to use the traffic lights when crossing the road and ensure that students who cycle to school wear a properly fitted helmet.
