1.1 National English Writing Competition 2024

2. UPCOMING EVENTS

2.1 Head Prefect Campaign

2.2 P2 Science in Stellar Programme

The P2 students will be going on a learning journey to the Science Centre on 5, 6, 8, 9, 13 and 15 May as part of the Science in Stellar Programme. The objective of the learning journey is to develop a lively curiosity in our students of the world around them and enable them to make connections to what they have learnt in the Stellar texts they have read during English lessons. Through this learning journey, the students will learn more about the different characteristics of insects and their life cycles. 2.5 Learning Journey to KidZania

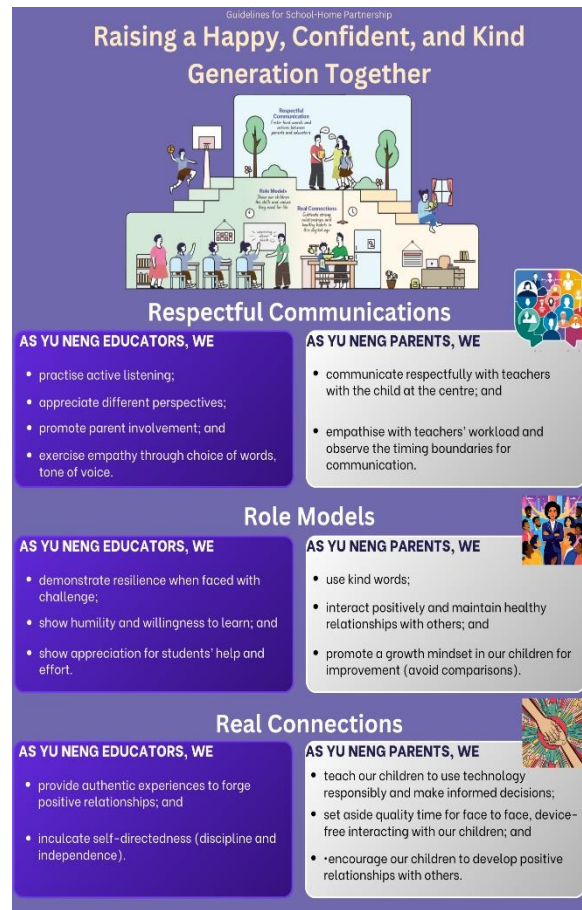

3.2 2025 Primary One Registration Exercise for Admission to Primary 1 in Year 2026 – Phase 1

Phase 1 registration is for a **Singapore Citizen (SC)** or **Permanent Resident (PR)** child born between **2 January 2019** and **1 January 2020** (both dates inclusive) and has a sibling currently studying in our school. For the 2025 P1 Registration Exercise, parents who are registering their younger child under Phase 1 are to register during the Phase 1 registration period in early July 2025. Parents are not required to submit Phase 1 registration from April 2025.

International Students are not eligible for Phase 1. They are required to first submit an online indication of interest at end May/ early June 2025. 
